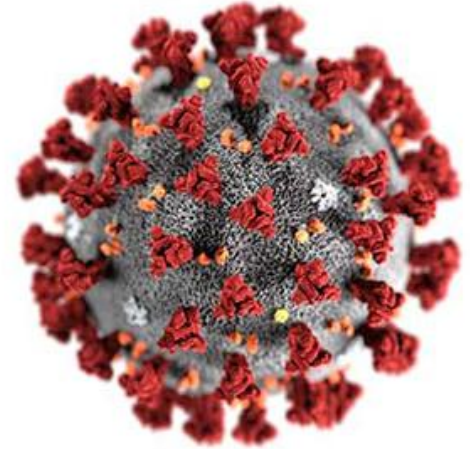


EdTech Historical Perspective

- Federal & State funding ensured equitable statewide support
- ESD and OSPI partnership: Technology Roundtables, technology planning support
- OSPI EdTech funding for multiple staff positions (1 to 5)
- Funding for 9 ESDs EdTech positions

Pandemic and EdTech Support

- OSPI staffing - EdTech Director
- ESD staffing - Some but not all ESDs
- Collaborative efforts - Collaboration to “raise all boats”



Challenges We Discovered

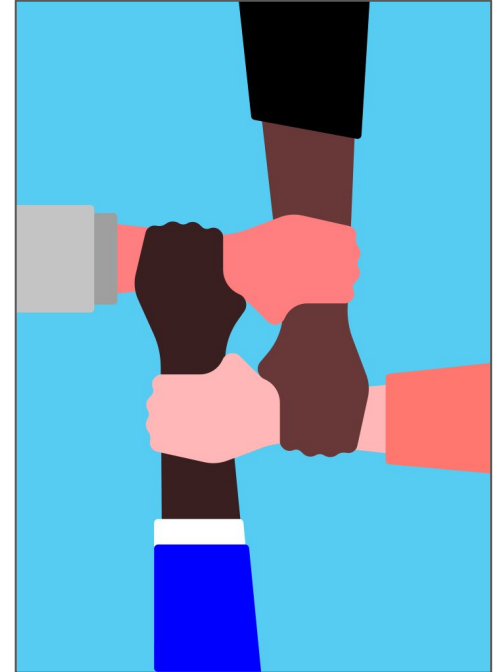
- Differing approaches to district EdTech support

What We Learned from the Crisis

New ways of partnering

- Working together to support educators/students statewide
- Temporarily setting aside lanes and territory

- Return to equitable, statewide EdTech supports



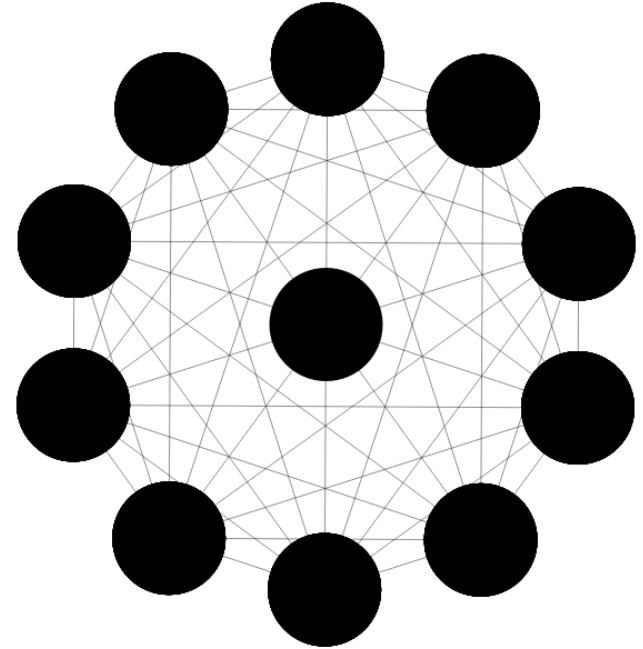
Things that Worked

 - E-rate support



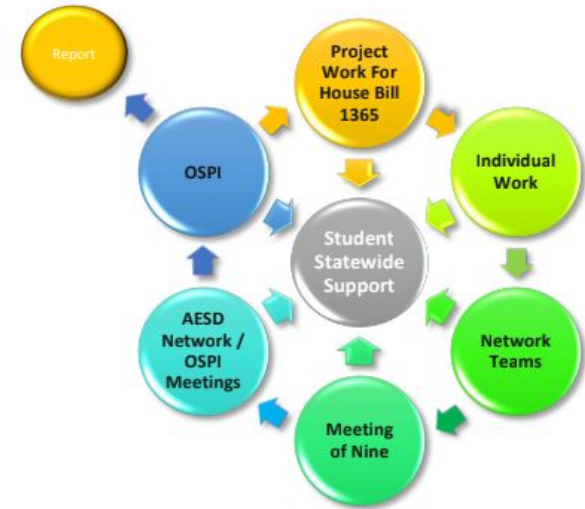
HB 1365: Equity of Access & State Legislative Leadership

Goal: Provide technology tools and education to every student in Washington State through equitable access, teacher and district support.

- Focus on addressing state-wide technology consultation
- Technology procurement (*Funding for Digital Equity & Inclusion grants; 1:1 device and inclusionary initiatives, adaptive / assistive*)
- Technology training, offering direct services to districts
- Media Literacy & Digital Citizenship and Internet Safety

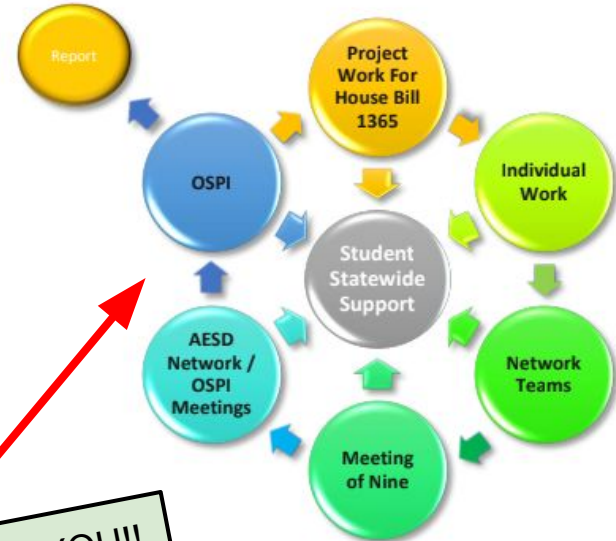
