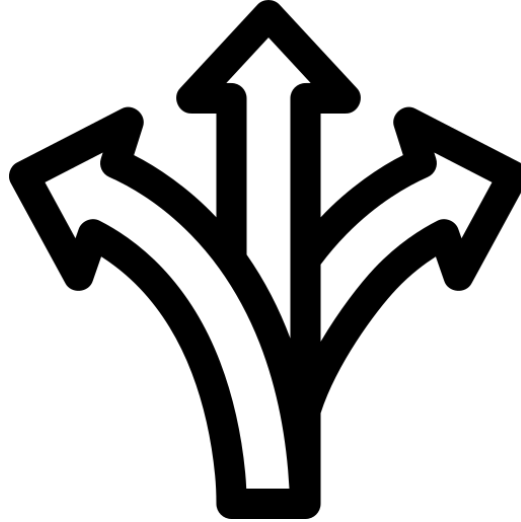
Your Educator Journey Map



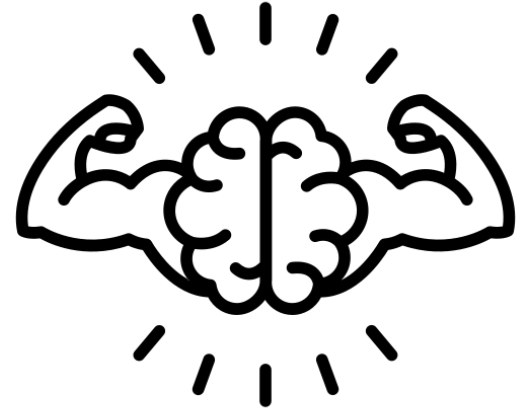

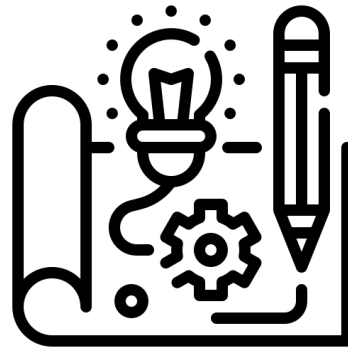

Connections Web

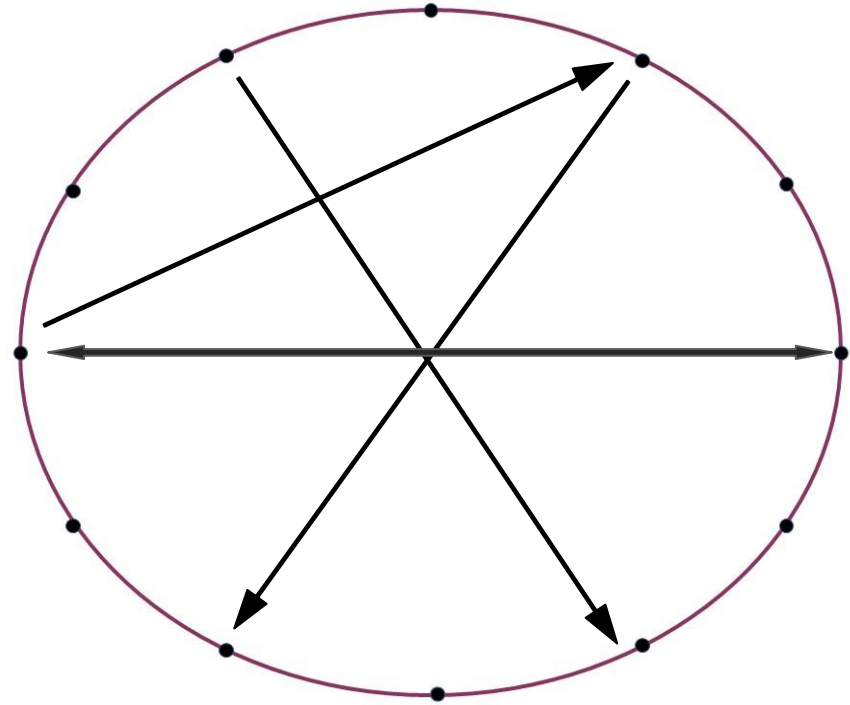
This strategy involves asking participants to list the parts, characteristics, or steps of any content on the dots around a circle.

Participants discuss connections among the parts or concepts, describing the relationships between the terms.

Arrows are drawn on the on the circle to show the nature of the relationship.

After connections are made, a web is formed. The facilitator can ask [follow-up questions](#) about underlying principles that “hold” the whole together and what would happen if one part was removed.

A “stretch” is applied when participants develop a generalization about the content- a statement that shows the big idea of the major principle behind the concept connections.

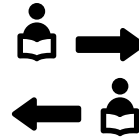

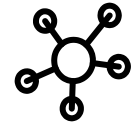

The Relationship Check is a tool for self-reflection and conversation designed to assess where relationships with young people are strong and where they can grow.



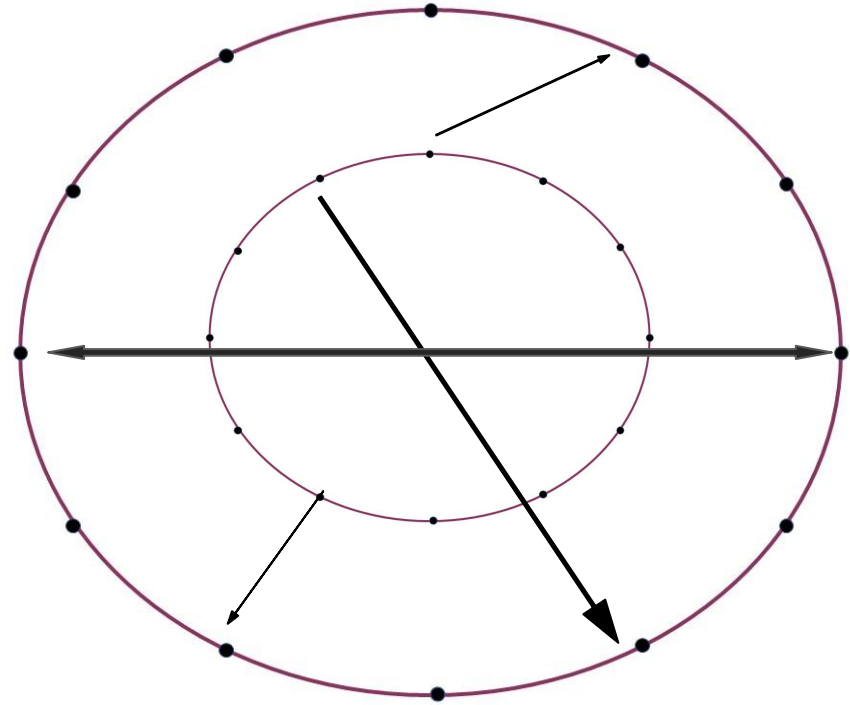
