

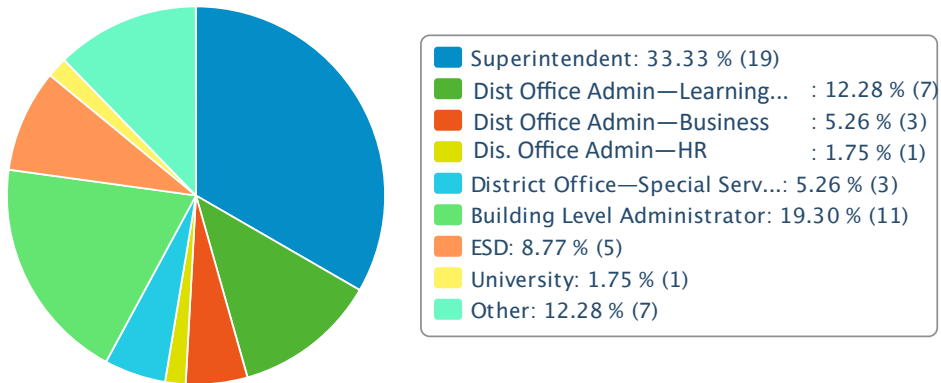

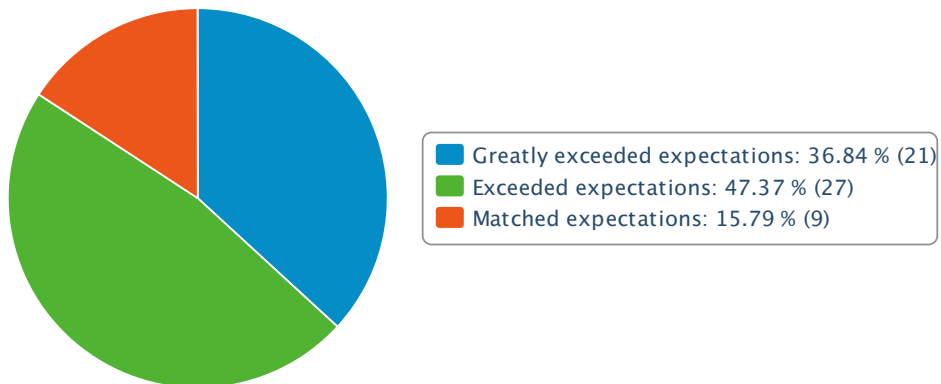

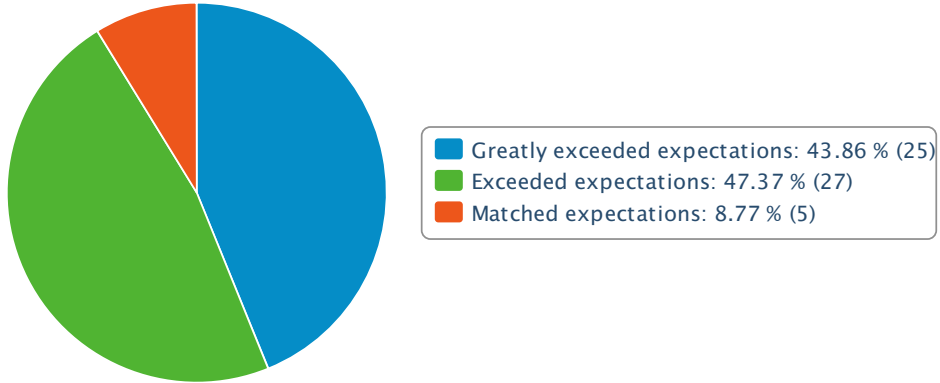

2. Please rate the relevance and quality of the conference.

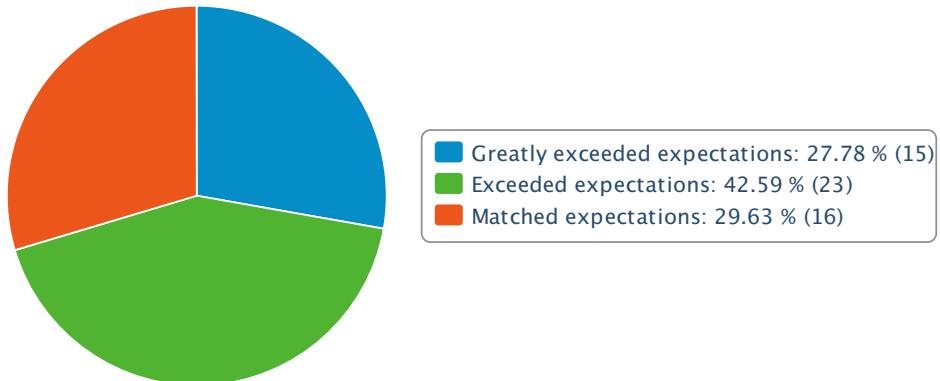

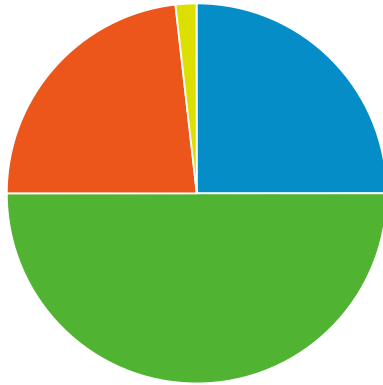

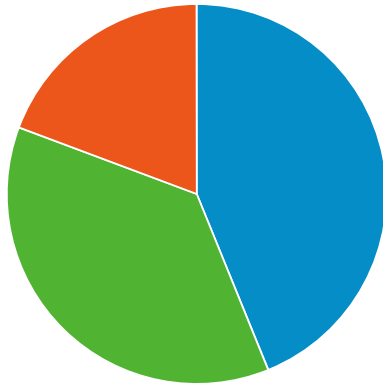
4. Please rate the extent to which advocacy for students and leadership have been met.

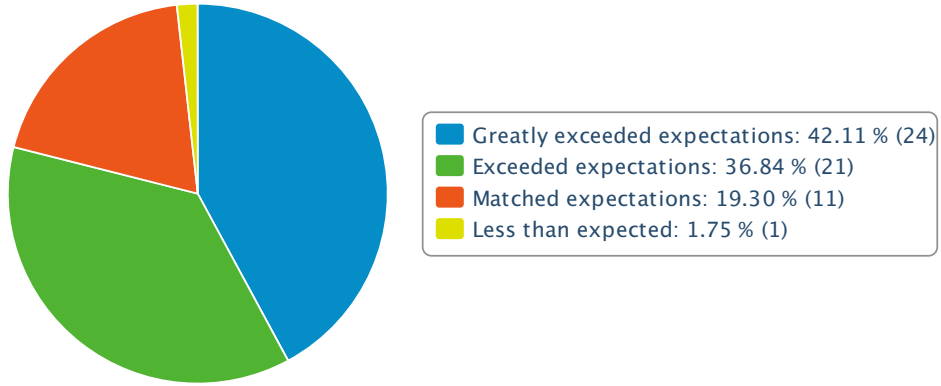

With all WASA trainings, there should be ample opportunities for adult “sense making.” Mo's main teaching move was to debrief with the whole group (8-10 times). While this worked okay (people had interesting things to say), it meant that 5-6 people spoke each time instead of everyone (at their tables or with partners). It also became rote. We did have two table talks -- one of which was the 15-minute rumble activity. The rumble activity was great, the room came alive, but it was cut off to move on (I get the need to move on, just wish there had been a check in. I think people needed more time as we all were very engaged.) I know the presenter is the “expert” but a bit more learner-centered approach, with a greater number of turn and talks, private think time, more movement by getting up and talking to people across the room -- all those things would have better supported my learning. That said, the core content was very interesting and something I aspire to use in my practice.
